

NEVEH SHALOM 10 YEAR AND SHORT TERM INCREMENTAL GROWTH PLAN

Portland, Oregon

After meeting with a Planning Committee to discuss needs and interests, two basic planning options with multiple scenarios were proposed. Both options viewed the complex as a potential "spiritual city" with different architectural forms expressing their function to unite the disparate architecture of the existing sanctuary and administrative wing. New facilities to be provided included a chapel, more classrooms, increased administrative space, social hall, and parking. Option 1 had new facilities grouped around the existing courtyard. Option 2 had them placed on the east side of the sanctuary. Both options included a sunken parking garage facing Dosch, new entry through the sanctuary, senior housing on the west portion of the site, and cost estimates. The incremental plan took the preferred courtyard option and proposed phasing the chapel, added classrooms, and enlarged administration offices.
